Dear families and friends



happiness to us all. As always, we have hit the ground running and the boys and girls are busy learning and enjoying being at our lovely school.

#### Please take a few minutes to read through this newsletter and make a note of any relevant dates for your diary.

As we begin a new school term, the ongoing impact of the pandemic is never far from our thoughts. For every family the experiences and impact will be different but there is no doubt that it is continuing to affect our daily lives and routines in one way or another.

As a school, we have been lucky although we experienced a tricky patch just after Halloween with a high number of pupils and some staff absent. Thankfully it passed and everyone remained safe and well.

Moving forward, the current levels of transmission in the community appear to very high which may negatively impact us again, especially if we have staff shortages. This challenge arises due to the availability of substitute teachers being so limited, it was impossible to secure substitute teachers just before Christmas. It has been predicted that this situation will continue in the coming weeks and put additional pressure on schools. This is a concern but I want to reassure you that I will do everything in my power to keep the children in school and to avoid any form of remote learning. This will be a last resort for us and only when we cannot manage to ensure the health and safety of those involved.

The best place for our children is in school, receiving high quality face-to-face learning, connecting socially, building positive relationships and engaging constructively with learning.

If at any stage, we are forced to move to Remote Learning, The Department of Education has provided updated guidance.

In the meantime, I prefer to have a positive outlook and manifest positivity. Keep in touch with us, we are here to help.

Thank you in advance for your support in all that we do, we are grateful for it.

In addition to the above information, all schools have now been issued with CO2 monitors for the classrooms. This helps us to manage the ventilation which is recommended to avoid further spread of the virus. In response to the indicators on the monitors we are directed to open the windows and doors. It would be advisable if the children could add another layer of clothing such as a vest or t-shirt under their uniform. Body warmers are also a good option as they allow the children to continue to work without any hinderance. This is optional but something to consider especially on colder days.

## **325 CLUB NEWS**

I wanted to let you know that due to the increase in COVID cases, we may experience staff absences which may affect the availability of this club.

I want to alert you in advance that there may be occasions when I have to cancel this club at late notice. This will happen if there is insufficient staff to supervise it safely.

On days when there is adverse weather such as snow/icy conditions, this club may also need to be cancelled. Safety will be at the forefront.

Prompt collection at 4.00pm and 5.00pm is expected.

### REMINDER-ADVERSE WEATHER/SNOW ARRANGEMENTS

Luckily, we do not experience too many days where we feel that we may not be able to open the school or that weather conditions may hinder attendance at school. To put it into context, children are expected to attend 185 school days so we are only talking about a very small number of adverse weather days when conditions may cause us an issue. We try not to dwell on these days but focus on all the other happy days we come to school.

In the event of adverse weather conditions, the most important factor is the Health & Safety of every member of our school community.

To ensure you do not feel under pressure or put anyone in a situation where children or adults are at risk, we would encourage you to carefully assess the weather conditions before making the journey to school. We understand that some families including staff live in areas where there are steep hills and untreated roads.

We do not want anyone to worry about the journey to school. We also understand that parents and guardians have the added pressure of needing to get to work on time. Unfortunately, we cannot predict or change bad weather but we can offer solutions to help us have a more pleasant experience.

#### <u>Please note the following:</u>

As far as is possible we will always try to open the school, however, on the rare occasion where it is deemed too dangerous, a message will be sent through the website and on Facebook at the earliest opportunity.

In the event of adverse weather, there is no immediate rush required to get to school. Children will be marked in for the morning session if they arrive in before 10.30am. Just contact the office to let us know. If you can avoid driving up the hill to the school, please do so as it can be very slippy, especially around school time when traffic is going in both directions. A later arrival will also mean you will miss some of the congestion.

**Just an additional note on the above**: I have tried to get the 'gritter' to come up and salt the hill and have been told that we need to have a larger number of road users to justify this. If you have time, I would encourage you to continue to put pressure on the local MLAs and council to afford us this much needed service.
